## BRITISH MUSLIMS' LEADER RESIGNS

Sir Hubert Stewart-Rankin resigned from the presidency of the British Muslim Society after a meeting at the society's headquarters in Great Russell Street last night. 'A resolution, put to the meeting by Sir Hubert, that the society had no connexion with the Ahmadi movement in India, was defeated, and Sir Hubert and several other members walked out. Sir Hubert Stewart-Rankin, who said afterwards that he was forming a new Muslim society in this country which would be orthodox and non-sectarian, was elected president of the British Muslim Society a month ago in succession to the late Lord Headley.
